

Competition Rules

- It is the responsibility of all competitors to obtain necessary angler permits or licenses as demanded by the waterway in the state being fished. AFT will not allow a competitor to continue in the tournament without the legal licenses and permits. All documents should be brought and carried at events.
- Must only fish between Cabarita headland and, Boundary Creek Rd, Broadwater
- Anglers may fish any line class with spin, baitcast, spincast or flyfishing tackle.
- Any speed restrictions, non-boating or non-fishing areas must be adhered to.
- Fishing is NOT permitted within any defined non-boating or non-fishing areas. If asked to leave an area public or private, you must do so.
- Fish must be caught during the designated times and kept in the livewells.
- Bream Bag limit is dependent on the series, refer the website for this detail.
- If you already have a full bag and catch another, you must immediately release a fish, you are not allowed to keep catching fish then upgrade later.
- Anglers caught fishing with more than the Bream bag limit above will be immediately disqualified and AFT staff reserves the right to check boats live wells during competition hours.
- Any complaints regarding a breach of the rules must be addressed to the on-site Official within 24hrs of specific incidents. Penalties for rule and conduct violations may include the following:

Photo Rules

- Each legal or oversize native fish angled must be photographed (as per photo rules) and released as soon as possible to the water. All native fish entered must be catch and release only. Entrants found keeping entered fish will be instantly disqualified.
- Photo must be of a live fish. Photos showing signs of mutilation, damage, excessive blood or improper handling will be deemed unfit for entry.
- It is the entrant's responsibility to provide their own brag mat. (Can be purchased at check In)
- Fish must be photographed on a brag mat of good quality with easily visible numbers.
- Photo must be taken square on to the fish and mat.
- Your entry rego card must be placed at the top of the mat near the fishes head and clearly be able to be read in the photo.
- The nose of the fish must be level with the zero mark on the mat or the stopper if the mat has one.
- The dorsal fin must point to the top of the mat.
- The brag mat must be on a flat surface with no creases.
- The entire fish and the measuring edge of the mat must be visible in the photo with the length of the fish being clearly identified and legible.
- Entries are judged on length. Measurements will be rounded down to the nearest centimetre. To take the lead the fish must be 1cm longer than the current leader. In the event of a tie the entry received first will be deemed the winner so if you catch a fish get that photo in ASAP.
- Any digital manipulation of the photo will be deemed as cheating and will result in the angler being disqualified.
